V. New Business

Presentation by Erika Benti on SkiSU, Ram's Ride Right, U-Lock Program

SKISU

- History of SkiSU
 - Eco leader project 2017: no easy way to get to ski resorts without a car
 - Funded by ATFAB 2018-2019 to present
 - o Trend: epic pass resorts tend to be less popular than ikon pass resorts
 - For 2021-2022 season, focused on 5 ikon pass resorts and had closer to full occupancy
 - Moved up departure time to 5:30 from 6am to avoid traffic along I70 corridor
 - New SkiSU instagram @skisuatcsu
- Plans for 2022-2023
 - 12 trips planned, partnership with ikon pass continued with college discount
 - January though early April mostly on Saturdays
 - Locations determined based on last season's survey
 - 12 employee tickets (\$30) and 42 student tickets (\$23)
- SkiSU Benefits
 - In a post survey most students said they would not otherwise have skied SkiSU is not just replacing car trips, it is providing access
 - Highly satisfied from post surveys
 - o Reduction in co2, access to the outdoors without a car
- Questions
 - Inflation

- Not expected to be an issue this year. May become important with funding request for the next year
- o Number of unique customers?
 - Not entirely sure but except it is a mix of unique students and repeat riders on each trip
- Estimate of how the year to year cost would change if student tickets were raised to at-cost?
 - If all tickets were \$30 SkiSU would be near self sufficient
- O Why was last year so successful?
 - Lucky with weather, social media engagement, word of mouth, established on campus

Rams Ride Right

- Originally proposed by campus bicycle advisory committee to focus on bike safety on campus. Goal is to pair enforcement with encouragement
- Format
 - o Pop up safety hotspots around campus staffed by "rambassadors" and CSU PD
 - Locations are high traffic locations, dismount zones
 - o \$5 ram cash as an incentive for doing the right thing
- More than 4000 engagements in fall 2021
- Partnership with CSU Police. Approximately 50% of events include police officers
- Updated safety stop law in effect April 2022
 - Change the approach for fall 2022: will now intercept folks at the beginning or end of their rides at prominent bike parking locations to talk about the new safety stop law
 - Will still have pop up events at dismount zones
- Questions
 - Could information booths be placed near residence halls to focus on freshmen who may not understand rules around dismount zones
 - Could there be more enforcement by police at LSC dismount zone
 - This might be a more effective ask for ASCSU for more officers and higher pay
 - How to account for bias
 - Demographic information of participants
 - Materials in Spanish?

Bike theft prevention – Ulock and camera project

- 52K for the purchase of ULocks and cameras to reduce bike theft (the number 1 crime at CSU)
- 3000 ulocks purchased with 1300 distributed to date
- Program heavily advertised to first year students
- Unclear as of September how program has impacted bike thefts on campus
- Will send a survey to students
- No info yet about cameras
- Questions
 - o Bike locks are somewhat small, might lead to incorrectly locking bikes
 - Ratio of ULock to Cable Lock thefts
